1. Program Overview

- Global Energy Technology Policy Professionals Program (GETPPP) is a part of a Global Talent Training Program supported by the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Energy (MOTIE) of the Republic of Korea and the Korea Institute of Energy Technology Evaluation (KETEP).
- GETPPP is a Master's and Doctoral degree program to educate government officials and specialists in the field of energy technology and policy in emerging countries.
- Our mission is to contribute to the inclusive energy development of emerging countries and promote strong and close cooperation.
- GETPPP aims to develop a solid foundation for the expansion of cooperation in the energy sector by establishing an energy and human network among nations, academia, and the private sector.
- Facilitate the access of Korean companies to the global energy markets through global energy networks and platforms.

2. Qualifications

- A government official in related areas (Ministry of Energy, Ministry of Natural Resources, Ministry of Industry and Trade, etc.)
- An energy specialist working at the national electric/power companies
- A bachelor's or master's degree (Applicants for a doctoral degree must hold a master's degree)

3. Scholarship

- The successful applicants will enroll in the 2021 Fall Semester (starting in September) according to Korea University academic year, and a regular scholarship will be granted as followed.
 - Tuition (Master's students: up to 2 years, Doctoral students: up to 3 years)
 - Stipend: 1,500,000 KRW per month
 - Costs of textbooks and labs activities
 - One-way Airfare (actual amount up to 1,500,000 KRW)
 - Insurance for foreign students
 - Dormitory fee
 - Korean language and Culture Programs
 - Cost of COVID-19 test

4. Admissions Time Line

- May 10th (Mon), 2021 ~ June 7st (Mon), 2021: Submission of application form via email to getppp@korea.ac.kr
- June 14th (Mon), 2021: Submission of the original documents to the Graduate School of Energy and Environment, Korea University, via airmail

- Send an e-mail to getppp@korea.ac.kr by scanning and saving into one file (file name: 2021 getppp admission_last name_first name_master or doctoral)
- Applicants recommended by Korean companies can directly submit application materials to the company, not via the Korean Embassy (The Korean company collects the application materials and mailed to the Graduate School of Energy and Environment)
- All original application documents must arrive at the Graduate School of Energy and Environment, Korea University by June 14th (Monday) by airmail (NOT via email).

- June 2021 : Selection of interviewees, Video conference interview (Applicants who have passed 1st round document screening), Notification of admission
- July, 2021: Preparation of arrival (Visa, Dormitory, etc.)
- August, 2021: Arrival in Korea (Self-quarantine and regular corona tests)
- September, 2021: Beginning of fall semester 2021

- ① Documents must be submitted according to the list of documents.

- All Documents must be submitted in original form. Copies, scanned documents, and documents received by fax are NOT accepted.
- Documents not written in English must be accompanied by a notarized English translation.

- ② Print out the completed application form and send it with all other required documents by mail.

- When submitting documents, please attach the list of documents on the envelope. Please mark the documents correctly and put them in the envelope in order of the list of documents.
- After submitting the documents by mail, you should email us (getppp@korea.ac.kr) and check the arrival status.

- ③ If it is difficult to verify the facts only with the documents submitted by the applicant, additional documents may be requested.

6.Important Notice for All Applicants

- ① Only the original copies will be acceptable and photocopied, scanned or faxed documents will not be permitted.
- ② If the documents are not written in English, please submit the notarized documents(within 3 months) translated in English.
- ③ The spelling of your name and the birth date must be matched those shown in your passport or other official documents in your country.
- ④ None of the submitted records and documents are returnable, also the application fee is non-refundable.
- ⑤ Important notice will be announced by e-mail. Please indicate email address 1 and email address 2 accurately. They should have the different email account each other (yahoo, hotmail, gmail, and etc).
- ⑥ If any of the submitted materials contain false information, admission will be rescinded.
- ⑦ Applicants should take full responsibility for any disadvantages due to the mistakes or omissions on the application.
